Profile Pic



mentions size

NAMES



- Username @name, changes rarely
- Display Name changeable, for seasons or notices like:
 - COMMS OPEN / CLOSED artist or writer commissions
 - hiatus taking a break from Twitter
 - DMs Closed taking a break from direct messages

NAMES


- Choosing a "sizey" name shows you are a person, not a bot
- Long display names will be cut off on mobile
- **Consistency!** When making seasonal changes, try to keep some part of your display name or picture visible or your own friends won't recognize you.

PICS



- Profile Picture can be a photo, art, graphic
- NSFW caution! Twitter shuts down accounts w/pics & banners that have X-rated, violent, or gory content



You may not post media that is excessively gory or share violent or adult content within live video or in profile header, List banner images, or Community cover photos. Media depicting sexual violence and/or assault is also not permitted.

PICS







- Always ask permission & credit the artist, "PFP @artist"
- Customize your own free avatar w/ Picrew character makers, which you can find by searching for the watermark
 - The two above are by @makowwka and @makowka

BIO

• 18+ and/or your age range so kink accounts know you're safe to follow (many will avoid interacting or block without this)



- Your size/s
- Your pronouns & identities
- Your likes so folks know what they're opting in to see if they follow you & to help you find friends w similar interests
- Your hard limits if needed
- #SizeTwitter helps people find you

- Need more space than 160 characters?
 - Use the location for age, pronouns, etc.
 - Use **linktr.ee** as a way to organize all the links, accounts, writing, artwork, videos, etc. that you want people to access
 - Try a pinned tweet, which you can update as often as you want. This is perfect for sharing more likes/dislikes, roleplay (RP) preferences, commission details, Ko-fi or donation info.
 You can also pin your most recent artwork/story.

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

- Bots are fake accounts that spread & take over quickly
 - bots are programmed to follow your followers
- They need to be blocked & reported regularly
- But how to know who's real & who's a bot?
 - username contains numbers
 - easily generated first/last names like @EdgarLammot52,
 display name Edgar Lammot
 - o appears anonymous without a photo, banner, or bio
 - o photo is a generic face or anime character
 - bio is generic, sounds like an Al without no mention of size
 - new account, following a lot, has few followers
 - "Not followed by anyone you're following"

- @Mention: @ followed with the name of a user will create a link to their account in your tweet and notify them about your mention.
- #: Hashtag. One or two is likely enough. #SizeTwitter is one of them.
- **DM**: **Direct message**. Private message between two users. In order to send a DM, the recipient must follow you or change settings to allow all messages.
- **TL (Timeline):** List of tweets from users you follow and interact with most often. This is Twitter's main screen.
- Thread: a collection of tweets from one person meant to be read together.

 You can reply to any tweet in the thread, but usually you want the first or last.





- RT (re-tweet): RT a Tweet will share it with all your followers, unless they select "Turn off Retweets" for a specific person.
- QRT (quote re-tweet): Quote RT will share a tweet with all your followers and allows you to comment on it, but it impacts the likes/comments on the original and many artists and writers prefer you didn't QRT them
- @Mention: @ followed with the name of a user will create a link to their account in your tweet and notify them about your mention.
- **#FF (Follow Friday):** Each Friday, Twitter users like to share their favorite accounts with the #FF hashtag.








- NSFW: Not Safe For Work. Often used to describe online posts that are mainly associated with heavy nudity, sexuality, heavy profanity and other adult topics. Also includes violence and gore.
- SFW: Safe For Work. Used to describe content that could be viewed in the presence of your boss and colleagues.
 - #sfwgt stands for Safe For Work Giant/Tiny, and connects a part of the size community that does not want to interact with sex, violence, or adult themes.


IMPORTANT: MINORS MAY USE THIS TAG. Also includes #gtfluff.

• MDNI: Minors Do Not Interact. Meant to discourage people under the age of 18 from following or interacting with content.

• Mute: A safety feature that lets you mute a person, word, or phrase. They can see you and what you post, but you can't see them unless you go to their account. If they reply to your tweet, you'll have the option to view it or leave it hidden.







- **Unfollow:** You will stop seeing their tweets in your timeline, unless a mutual friend interacts with their content.
- **Block:** When you block a person, they will not see your tweets or anything beyond your bio, and you won't see their tweets either. It won't notify them, but they will be able to tell when they try to look at your profile.
- Report: Asking Twitter to take action to remove an account that is harassing, using hate speech, threatening violence, or which is a fake account.

 Unfortunately can be very hit or miss. It helps to have lots of people reporting.




SUPPORTING ARTISTS

WHEN SHARING ART

Always credit the artist & ask permission whenever possible!

It can be REALLY demoralizing to a creator to see their work shared without credit.




Don't know who to credit? It's best not to share, unless you're asking for help identifying the artist.

Try Reverse Image Search on Google and TinEye to find the source.







SHOW YOUR SUPPORT

- Publicly compliment what you love about their art! Likes are good, RT are great, but nothing beats a reply.
- Not only does it give a vital boost to self esteem and motivation, a reply to their tweet will help boost visibility in the algorithms and increase their chances of being seen. This is especially true within the first 20 minutes and the first 24 hours. Unless your compliment really needs to be privately sent in DMs, reply to the tweet and you'll help more people discover their work!
- **Bonus points:** ask them questions, tag friends you think would like it, and have a full conversation in the tweet thread---you'll help keep their visibility going all day!

TWITTER ETIQUETTE

Always remember there is (usually) a human being on the other side of that tweet—a person with responsibilities, trauma, hopes, & goals you may never know about. Empathy and boundaries are important here.



Don't know people well?

Try not to interrupt a convo between two people you don't know yet. Reply to the first tweet, or if many people are responding, jump in!




COMMUNITY TIPS



ASK, DON'T ASSUME

You never know for sure what a person's size, gender, sexuality, or kinks are... until you check their bio or ask.

"Are you into [Kink A]?"
"What size are you feeling?"
"Would you be interested in..."



LET PEOPLE BE WHATEVER SIZE THEY FEEL.

Don't pressure tinies to grow.

Don't shrink smaller than a tiny woman to force her to play your Giantess.

Nobody is here to be your wish fulfillment machine.

(And if they are, that is a specific BDSM dynamic to negotiate with consent.)

ADVICE FOR DMS

Twitter's TL is public. If you need more privacy, ask before sending a DM to a new person. A polite tweet to this person once they've followed you will let you know whether they're OK with it or not.



Don't start with just "hi." The other person then has to work to figure out why you're DMing.



Compliment choices & concepts instead of bodies for convo starters. Ex: "I love that fantasy too!" vs "nice tits"



DMs take time & energy. Nobody owes you a response unless you've negotiated that (ex. RP or comms).

ACCESSIBILITY



ALT TEXT

A quick & easy way to give access to people who are blind or visually impaired and have kinks.

I know of at least three size kink people who have relied on screen readers. Images are inaccessible if we don't add a little alt text.

Keep it short, 1-2 sentences. What would you want to know if you couldn't see it?



CONTENT TAGS

Content Tags: the words at the beginning of a story, video, tweet, blog post, performance, or other media that give the audience some advance notice of what to expect. Not always sensitive content, they also include genders, sizes of characters.

Remember to be kind and considerate to others. Not everyone is into the same things, don't impose personal fantasies onto posts that aren't yours without the consent of the other party, and tag for triggering content to let others continue to enjoy their own space as well.









CONTENT TAGS

Tags are good because they:

- Are the only way for people online to have the chance to opt in or out of a sexual experience with fully informed consent
- Help people find what they like & mute terms they don't
- Help with accessibility
- Allow people with different hard limits to stay friends & build trust
- Help people say yes to edgeplay
- Let us decide when, where, & how long we engage with intense content
- Can reduce mutes/unfollows, esp. when trying new kinks
- Can be tempting and intriguing

TIPS FOR TAGGING

Try to use common, predictable words to help people mute!



Effective tags:

CW: pineapple, pizza toppings

#Pineapple #PizzaToppings

(pineapple on pizza)

(pineapple, pizza debate)

F/m, growth, romance, pineapple on pizza, foodgasms



Ineffective tags:

yellow fruit #PINE #APPLE pineappley

TOP 15 TAGS TO ALWAYS USE

How do you know what to tag? The highest priority tags relate to the first question I ask, "What could cause harm if someone had trauma around it?" The remaining topics are commonly taboo or are likely to cause a visceral reaction.



The next slide contains mention of topics around violence, death, sexual assault, and other "dark" themes.

If you want to minimize the screen view and turn off your audio, I will say "OK" in the chat when I have moved on from this slide.

TOP 15 TAGS TO ALWAYS USE

How do you know what to tag? The highest priority tags relate to the first question I ask, "What could cause harm if someone had trauma around it?" The remaining topics are commonly taboo or are likely to cause a visceral reaction.

- 1.Death
- 2. Violence, crush, stomp, destruction, smother, impact play
- 3. Blood, gore, marks, bruises, pain
- 4. Rape, nonconsensual/noncon, dubious consent/dubcon, unaware, sleep/somnophilia, hypnosis, mind control
- 5. Abuse (physical, emotional, or mental)
- 6. Drug, alcohol use
- 7. Weight play, weight gain/loss, obesity, bingeing, starvation, food denial
- 8. Viruses, medical conditions/disabilities, mental health
- 9. Vore
- 10. Insertion, unbirth
- 11. Anthro/furry, pup play, pet play
- 12. Transformation, objectification
- 13.Feet
- 14. Toilet play, watersports, farting, scat, diaper play
- 15. Incest, age play, age regression

All of these topics relate to common fantasies that can be negotiated and safely explored by consenting adults. If your body is turned on by any of these "shadow" topics, you are not alone.

If you decide to play, then how you play matters, esp. in public spaces online like Twitter, DeviantArt, and forums.
